Hundreds of experts and academicians have collaborated with AASIC as the author for the papers published in our online proceeding system. This has resulted in 204 total citations and gained an H-index value of 7. This has proven that AASIC has an established and well-recognized platform for publication. However, we are very open to collaboration with other journal publishers or institutions to enhance our publications' quality.
